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VignA-Symposium South Africa, 24-25 October, 2024

The theme of this year's VignA symposium, *Crafting Transnational Dialogical Spaces in the Global North and the Global South,* points to the importance of transnational networking when it comes to exploring complex social phenomena and human experiences.

The symposium was organised by Prof. Irma Eloff and her team at the Institute of Educational Psychology at the University of Pretoria, in collaboration with the VignA core team, and took place partly in presence and partly as a hybrid conference.

The two key notes highlighted programmatic cornerstones for a fruitful, transnational dialogue in and through research, and outlined inspiring visions: Sarina de Jager (Dept of Humanities Education University of Pretoria) spoke on *The Artistry of Research*, the presentation by Daniela Lehner (Institute for Educational Research and Teacher Education, University of Graz) was entitled *Reimagining Educational Praxis: Engaging the Body, Emotions, and Pluriversal Perspectives*.

Other contributions dealt with methodological questions, and demonstrated the wide range of possible applications of vignette and anecdotal research, be it for researching teachers' anxiety during the Covid-19 pandemic, the fears of traumatised children in South Africa, the experiences of pregnant minors with HIV-positive mothers during the pandemic, or experiences of homophobic victimisation. Other studies gave an insight on the attitudes and competences of teacher educators in the area of the SDGs and issues of Islamic-religious education.

The contributions to the conference convincingly documented that phenomenological vignette and anecdotal research - also in conjunction with other experiential approaches - is particularly suited to making experiences traceable and comprehensible. The transnational dialogue between researchers makes it possible to broaden - sometimes even to irritate - our view from an intercultural and multiperspective point of view. At the same time, this endeavour remains challenging and at risk of failure; for that reason it is important not to obscure or ignore the limits of research approaches.

What was particularly touching were the enthusiasm and commitment of many researchers at the University of Pretoria, who apply and further develop vignette and anecdotal research in a wide range of subject areas.

VignA Network Meeting, 25 October, 2024

The VignA network meeting took place as part of the symposium in Pretoria. In addition to sharing impressions from the symposium, the agenda included reports from the various locations and from the core team. The following suggestions for the further development of the VignA were mentioned by the participants: the development of a dictionary for vignette researchers; to use vignette and anecdote research even more in other fields; to focus on the professionalisation of teachers, teacher educators and scientists, and to exchange ideas about the strengths and challenges as well as the limits of vignette and anecdote research; to deal with the challenges of translating vignettes (anecdotes): what is preserved, what is lost, even in different readings?

The highlight of the meeting was the first presentation of the VignA Awards 2024 to five researchers from Austria, Germany and South Africa.

New research projects in the VignA context

Project: "EQoL – Teaching the good life"

One project in which vignette research is once again being used is the FWF project "EQoL - Teaching the Good Life. Theory, Policy and Practice in Education to Promote Quality of Life in the 21st Century" (2023-2026) under the direction of Evi Agostini at the University of Vienna. The dimensions of happiness, well-being and quality of life have experienced an upswing in recent years. The political interest in these topics, which are increasingly taking centre stage, is particularly evident in various initiatives. One example of this is the initiative "Smart City Wien Framework Strategy 2019-2050:

Vienna's Strategy for Sustainable Development" (SCWR, 2019), which aims to promote a fair and sustainable quality of life in Vienna. The research team is investigating the central question for the research project: How does this significant trend affect education, and what role can education play in this?

Project: "STEPS – Sensitise perception, recognise multiplicity"

Vignettes are also used in the "STEPS" project (2024-2026) led by Petra Auer, Stephanie Mian and Elisabeth Gsottbauer at the Free University of Bolzano.

The project "STEPS - Sensitise perception, recognise multiplicity: Children's path to sustainability through narrative and participatory research" aims to demonstrate an alternative approach to education for sustainable development: By sharing perspectives among children, the aim is to raise awareness of their perceptual processes, increase sensitivity to the views of their peers, and stimulate a vision of their school as a sustainable, inclusive learning and living environment. By enabling children to contrast their own perceptions, the transformative potential of the experience in relation to their understanding of the world and themselves is to be taken seriously, and the gap between attitudes and actions is to be bridged.

Online methods workshop "Working with different formats of vignettes"


